Even high school kids have to carry their backpacks full of books and binders to and from school. Due to backpacks, these kids are suffering from back pain. A 2010 study from the University of California, San Diego, concluded that a full third of kids, aged 11 to 14, who wore backpacks reported back pain. Rob Danoff, the researcher in charge of the study added, "Like the frame of a house, the spine is what keeps bodies strong and upright. If a backpack puts too much weight on this frame while a young body is still developing, it could change a child's posture, compress the spine, and damage growth."

¹⁰⁾ The Internet has become a major source of speech topics, but the quality and credibility of the information available online varies widely. If you use the Internet, try to stick with sources you know to be reliable. The subject indexes at your local library are also a good starting place for finding a speech topic. You can find material from which to quote and come up with more speech ideas there. Another way to find speech topics is to scan the table of contents of a weekly news magazine. The articles are usually interesting to a wide variety of the public and are suitable for a similarly wide range of audiences.

Changes in one variable within this system cannot be made without some effect on the other variables. The results of some of these effects may be trivial, but others may have a strong and lasting impact on the environment, including maintaining and improving the quality of human life. Because highway location and design decisions affect the development of the surrounding areas, it is important that environmental variables be given full consideration. Also, care should be exercised so that applicable local, state, and federal environmental requirements are met.

¹³⁾ One day after the space shuttle *Challenger* exploded, Ulric Neisser asked a class of 106 students to write down exactly where they were when they heard the news. Two and a half years later, he asked them the same question. In that second interview, 25 percent of the students gave completely different accounts of where they were. Half had significant errors in their answers and less than 10 percent remembered with any real accuracy. Results such as these are part of the reason people make mistakes on the witness stand when they are asked months later to describe a crime they witnessed. Between 1989 and 2007, 201 prisoners in the United States were proven innocent on the basis of DNA evidence. Seventy-five percent of those prisoners had been declared guilty on the basis of mistaken eyewitness accounts.

Everyone can talk and laugh as they please, or move about from room to room whenever they want and in whatever way they want, or play hide-and-seek in the halls. Very little progress could be made in studies in such a school, and pretty soon everybody would become uncomfortable because of continued noise and disorder. Rules exist merely to give every individual an opportunity to do uninterrupted work, and to accomplish the things they came to school to do.

Rather, we encounter only a series of high plateaus. Two things often obstruct the writing process: fear of criticism or failure and the need to impress the reader. Our awareness of permanence associated with committing ideas to paper can produce in us feelings of anxiety and lead to hesitation. We are often reluctant to reveal our thinking on paper because any resulting criticism either from superiors or readers will reflect negatively on our ability to think clearly and logically.

¹⁶⁾ At times the two sides at the negotiating table are like two persons in a canoe under powerful currents. They must combine their skills and strengths if they are to make headway through dangerous rapids, and around hidden rocks. Alone, they can make no progress and probably will lose control. If one side paddles harder than the other, the canoe will go in circles. Unless they cooperate, they risk wrecking or overturning the canoe on the obstacles in the river. Similarly, unless deal makers find ways of working together, the negotiations will be in trouble because of the many barriers during the process. Just as canoeists follow a few basic cooperative rules to propel their canoe, so too should deal makers follow rules in order to advance the negotiation process.

¹⁷⁾ One might wonder whether there is any reason to be concerned about overconfidence in students. After all, confidence is often considered a positive trait. Indeed, research suggests that students who are confident about their ability to succeed in school tend to perform better on academic tests than those with less confidence. That said, negative consequences also stem from being too confident in the classroom. Students who are overconfident about their ability to succeed in college end up feeling more disconnected and disillusioned than those with more modest expectations. Overconfidence can also leave students with mistaken impressions that they are fully prepared for tests and no longer need to study. Students who have relatively accurate perceptions regarding their progress in learning tend to use more effective study habits and perform better on tests than do those with more error-prone views of their knowledge.

¹⁸⁾ Storyteller Syd Lieberman suggests that it is the story in history that provides the nail to hang facts on. Students remember historical facts when they are tied to a story. According to a report, a high school in Boulder, Colorado, is currently experimenting with a study of presentation of historical material. Storytellers present material in dramatic context to the students, and group discussion follows. Students are encouraged to read further. In contrast, another group of students is involved in traditional research/report techniques. The study indicates that the material presented by the storytellers has much more interest and personal impact than that gained via the traditional method.

¹⁹⁾ Digging, which is seen as a destructive behavior to humans, is actually quite a natural behavior in dogs and their desire to dig can be most frustrating to owners. When digging occurs in your yard, it is actually a normal behavior redirected into something the dog can do in his everyday life. In the wild, a dog would be actively seeking food, making his own shelter, and so on. He would be using his paws in a purposeful manner for his survival. Since you provide him with food and shelter, he has no need to use his paws for these purposes, and so the energy that he would be using may show itself in the form of little holes all over your yard.

²⁰⁾ Pile on too much information, and you fall victim to one of two phenomena. On the one hand, you might not make a wise decision because the abundance of information suppresses even the most relevant past experiences. This phenomenon is called "knowledge trap," and it ignores our decision-making skills. On the other hand, faced with an abundance of information, you fall victim to "analysis paralysis"—unable to make any decisions in the face of so much data. People often become victims of the "knowledge trap" or "analysis paralysis," thinking they need to weigh every bit of information against all possible outcomes. Those people rarely make it very far.

²¹⁾ As toddlers begin to learn about *how to use the past tense of a word*, they often apply those rules to all words. If your toddler falls down and hurts his knee, he might say, "I falled down" instead of "I fell down." He might say, "I hurted my knee" just the way he says, "I patted the kitty." You do not need to make a big deal out of correcting him. Just say, "Oh, you hurt your knee. Let's wash off your hurt knee. I'll find a band-aid to fix your sore knee." Be proud that he is learning rules about language. When something already happened in the past, the rules of the English language dictate adding an ed sound to the end of the word, as in patted instead of pat. Your turn-taking talk has helped your baby figure out the "ed" rule!

²²⁾ Human beings are driven by a natural desire to form and maintain interpersonal relationships. From this perspective, people seek relationships with others to fill a fundamental need, and this need underlies many emotions, actions, and decisions throughout life. Probably, the need to belong is a product of human beings' evolutionary history as a social species. Human beings have long depended on the cooperation of others for the supply of food, protection from predators, and the acquisition of essential knowledge. Without the formation and maintenance of social bonds, early human beings probably would not have been able to cope with or adapt to their physical environments. Thus, seeking closeness and meaningful relationships has long been vital for human survival.

²⁴⁾ Fast fashion refers to trendy clothes designed, created, and sold to consumers as quickly as possible at extremely low prices. Fast fashion items may not cost you much at the cash register, but they come with a serious price: tens of millions of people in developing countries, some just children, work long hours in dangerous conditions to make them, in the kinds of factories often labeled sweatshops. Most garment workers are paid barely enough to survive. Fast fashion also hurts the environment. Garments are manufactured using toxic chemicals and then transported around the globe, making the fashion industry the world's second-largest polluter, after the oil industry. And millions of tons of discarded clothing piles up in landfills each year.

²⁵⁾ Imagine for a moment that an argument is like a house. A claim resembles a roof, in the sense that it covers all the text and needs support—not by beams, but by reasons in the form of evidence and explanations. Without the right kind of support arranged in sensible ways, an argument collapses like a poorly constructed building. To make your argument strong, you need to be as familiar with claims and support as a carpenter is with blueprints and building materials. All claims have the same general goal: to be accepted by an audience. A defining characteristic of a claim is that an audience will not accept the claim on its own: it needs support. Also known as elaboration, this support comes in the form of evidence and explanations.

²⁶⁾ Living in urban life is noisy. Cars moving on roads, lawnmowers, construction work, and all types of noise create a less peaceful environment. The low grade noises that irritate us are part of plenty of stressors we are exposed to every day. One way to create a welcoming, stress-free environment is through reducing this unwanted noise. Plants are used in many applications to reduce noise. Plants outside have been used for years to keep noise levels down. And plants can do the same thing inside a home or building. Plants and their leaves absorb sound, as well as diffuse or reflect the background noise, giving the surrounding environment a more peaceful atmosphere. Placing taller plants in containers by windows or in strategic areas where you want to diffuse the noise level is just one of the skills a landscape architect brings to every job.

Others pursue advanced careers as high-level clinicians, researchers, and policy makers. With additional training, nurses can advance their careers to better match their needs. 61) Enormous changes have taken place in maps and mapping in the past 25 years. We owe many of these changes to the computer; some map types that are now common, such as animated maps, were rarely seen because of the difficulty of drawing them and viewing them. The computer has changed the methods of creating maps, of viewing maps, and of publishing maps. In the past if you wanted to go for a hike, you might have purchased a topographic map — one showing the nature of the land, hills, and valleys—from an outdoor recreation company, or you might have ordered it from the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS). Now you can download a topographic map from the USGS, or you can buy topographic software from companies that will help you plan your hike and provide profiles of your route. You might even download large-scale topographic maps to your handheld GPS unit.

These rings can tell us how old the tree is, and what the weather was like during each year of the tree's life. Because trees are sensitive to local climate conditions, such as rain and temperature, they give scientists some information about that area's local climate in the past. For example, tree rings usually grow wider in warm, wet years and are thinner in years when it is cold and dry. If the tree has experienced stressful conditions, such as a drought, the tree might hardly grow at all during that time. Very old trees in particular can offer clues about what the climate was like long before measurements were recorded.

63) When it comes to insurance, the term "moral hazard" refers to situations where one party takes risks, but does not face the full costs of these risks. It usually arises when the buyer of insurance changes his or her behavior after obtaining insurance, so that the outcome works against the interests of the seller of insurance. For example, buyers of car theft insurance may be less careful about protecting their car against theft, because they will be repaid if someone steals their car. Some buyers of medical malpractice insurance (doctors) may be less careful about avoiding malpractice, because of the knowledge that malpractice costs will be covered by the insurer. Unemployment insurance may lead some people to be less hesitant about becoming unemployed, in the knowledge that their insurance will provide them with some income.

64) Social relationships benefit from people giving each other compliments now and again because people like to be liked and like to receive compliments. In that respect, social lies such as making deceptive but flattering comments ("I like your new haircut.") may benefit mutual relations. Social lies are told for psychological reasons and serve both self-interest and the interest of others. They serve self-interest because liars may gain satisfaction when they notice that their lies please other people, or because they realize that by telling such lies they avoid an awkward situation or discussion. They serve the interest of others because hearing the truth all the time ("You look much older now than you did a few years ago.") could damage a person's confidence and self-esteem.

65) We live in a culture that generally values intellect and reasoning with words. We tend to think of working with the hands, of building something physical, as low skills for those who are less intelligent. This is an extremely counterproductive cultural value. The human brain evolved in close connection with the hand. Many of our earliest survival skills depended on elaborate hand-eye coordination. To this day, a large portion of our brain is devoted to this relationship. When we work with our hands and build something, we learn how to arrange our actions and how to organize our thoughts. In taking anything apart in order to fix it, we learn problem-solving skills that have wider applications.

It is very important that in all stages of the process of sport preparation, young athletes can play an active and conscious role in the learning and training. This implies that coaches should focus more on situations that can be stimulating for learning and that can help youth to choose adequate options during sport activities. It also implies that coaches should not always provide youth the answers needed to resolve the problems they face in sport activities. Coaches must be able to objectively define what they want youth to learn in each stage of the training process and to help youth to make the right decisions by formulating the principles and orientations that guide decision-making. This will promote a more effective learning/decision making process.
